# **Pastor's Corner**

As of March 6, Lent is upon us. Just as in spring we clear and prepare the soil for new growth, and wash and sweep our homes clear of the winter's accumulated debris, so Lent is the time to open ourselves to God so God may do likewise with our souls.

Extra worship opportunities might at first seem like added weight to our schedule but we discover they are really times to ease the burdens of our hearts. The changes to the liturgy shift attention from preoccupation with our activities to pre-occupation with God's activity in Christ. The use of ashes, hymns sung in a minor key, purple or black paraments are not for the purpose of depressing our mood but to make way for the Holy Spirit to care for our spirits. Lent is the church's "reality check" and "revival time" rolled into forty days and six Sundays.

There are many reasons for members of St. Paul's to miss worship: schedule concerns, weather, hurts imagined or real – caused by self, others, or even God. Unfortunately, none of these excuses is valid during Lent. The different times for worship, the length of the season negate the first two.

That leaves hurt as a reason for staying away: You did or failed to do something. "They" did or failed to do something. Or - God did or failed to do something. Thus, it is guilt or shame or anger that have kept you away.

For these reasons Christ was born. For these reasons Jesus taught and walked the land. For these reasons Christ died on the cross. For this reason God raised him from the dead – to give us life.

In love, God brought the world into being. So show love, God took on our flesh. To share love, God's Spirit is among us. This love gathers us together that we might realize the promise of God's presence. Lent is the remembrance of this love and the renewal of its presence in our lives. The arms of Christ are extended wide in loving invitation. Come and worship.

#### It's time to rejoin the living. Come and worship! Consider these words by the author C. S. Lewis:

"To suppose that attending weekly worship is doing something for God...is to demonstrate a remarkable poverty of insight into the Christian enterprise. The Sabbath, at least according to Jesus, is not a responsibility but a gift (..."the Sabbath was made for humankind, not humankind for the Sabbath" -Mark 2:27). The opportunity to join in fellowship around the spoken and sacramental word of the Gospel is akin to the opportunity to take nourishment. Just as one does not ordinarily say, "I will do God a favor this morning by eating breakfast," so too it is inappropriate to suggest that God is benefitted by our eating the bread of life. Church attendance is God's stewardship to us, and while it is fair to say that not all persons who attend church are Christians, expect for the sick, all Christians to go church."
