THE TIME IS FINALLY HERE!!!!

Your Council members had a special meeting this week to discuss our in person/inside re-opening plan. We are happy to share that we will be OPENING THE SANCTUARY for in person services October 18th at 9:30am!! Things will look a little different but a video has been recorded and it should be helpful to watch and see how you will enter and exit the sanctuary and how the seating will be adjusted for social distancing purposes. For example, everyone will enter and exit from the SIDE/Handicap entrance. There will not be cushions on the pews, so bring your own if you would like. Masks are required to enter (we will have some at the door if you forget yours!) Temperatures will be taken at the entrance as well. Singing will only be done by the Cantor/Worship Leader during the service. In lieu of hymnals/ bulletins, we are also preparing the sanctuary to allow for easy viewing of the service/ bulletin by using a projector to cast the images for all to see together. (The video will be available the week before we open on Facebook and an email link will be sent out for your viewing.)

We know that the changes may seem daunting, however our Re-opening team has been working diligently and carefully to make sure that our sanctuary is prepped and ready to welcome our church family back in person as safely and in the most healthy way possible. The entire leadership of St. Paul's has struggled with these decisions over the past 6 months, however we have been leaning on His guidance and prayerfully discerning the path that has been necessary for the health of our whole Christian family.

We look forward to seeing many of you on the 18th. We know, however, that many are not able to return to in person worship yet—The good news is that our Facebook live stream of the service will be continuing uninterrupted at 9:25a! (And then uploaded to YouTube the next day.)
