PASTOR'S PEACE

"For I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or naked and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and visit you? And the king will answer them, 'I tell you the truth, just as you did it for one of the least of these brothers or sisters of mine, you did it for me." Matthew 25:35-40

Too often when we think of servanthood we equate that to being subordinate or lesser than those with whom we are interacting. Yet when Jesus teaches us to be good Christians, we are instructed to be servant to all, to put others first, and to embrace our role as a servant. I would counter that we are not subordinate, we are coming alongside others who may be in need of support, such as food or drink or money or services. Last month I spoke of benevolence and how we at St. Paul's have come together in many ways to serve our community and our church and as we become more comfortable in our surroundings, there are ways in which St. Paul's and our community are in need of servants.

The garden outside the church needs tending and would benefit from someone using their vision and talents as a gardener to recreate this space of peace and meditation. FEC will be placing new benches in the garden with some bearing messages for our church faithful. Service to our church can be that easy, just devoting a little bit of time to enhance the beauty of what is already a lovely space

During the summer, our youth will embark on several projects in our church and community to benefit those who may not be as fortunate as we, or who may just need a ray of hope in their life. On September 12, 2021, Congregational Life will be supporting the ELCA in their efforts to promote God's Work, Our Hands which will be a day of service to our community. Several projects are being discerned for this day of action where we can serve others as witness to our evangelism.
