Our congregations continue to support ministries that assist vulnerable people in their communities. These acts of service allow us to explore one of our most basic Lutheran convictions: All of life in Jesus Christ — every act of service, in every daily calling, in every corner of life — flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God's grace. On "God's work Our hands" Sunday we come together to restore and reconcile our communities. You do this kind of work every day -loving your neighbors and making your community a better place.

Council's Corner

Part of our church mission statement says that we challenge ourselves to share and live Christ's love within the congregation, within the community and to the larger world. We often do that, and one good example is what St. Paul's did recently for the Religious Coalition for Emergency Human Needs in Frederick.

The Religious Coalition helps prevent and alleviate the effects of poverty by responding to the emergency needs of Frederick County citizens. For forty years, the Coalition has provided emergency shelter for the homeless, including families, a point of entry for homeless prevention programs, after shelter programs, and healthcare assistance to the uninsured.

Recently, the Religious Coalition provided 33 families with emergency family shelter totaling 3,675 safe-bed nights of shelter. Unlike many homeless programs, the Coalition provides shelter and supportive services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and case management services.

The demand for homeless services continues to grow, and the Religious Coalition is currently embarked in a New Emergency Shelter Campaign to create a permanent family shelter, expand support services, and keep families together and return them to permanent housing.

In May, St. Paul's was able to make a gift of \$2,000 to the Beyond Shelter Campaign. As a result, thanks to the generosity of our congregation, the Coalition is getting closer to their goal of tripling the number of people they can help in Frederick County.

The past year and a half have been difficult for many of us, yet we here at St. Paul's should be proud of our willingness and ability to help those in the community that are suffering the most.

Pastor's Peace

⁸ But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the farthest parts [a] of the earth." (Acts 1:8) ²⁶ In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness, for we do not know how we should pray, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with inexpressible groanings. (Romans 8:26)

God works in mysterious ways and we are filled with the Holy Spirit as our advocate in life to restore our right relationship with God. I have mentioned a few times before that I often find solace and inspiration in the woods or on the lake, yet more recently I found joy in the middle of the night at my computer and subsequently on the radio as I drove to the church. One of the challenges I believed for me in taking up this new vocation was to be able to write a sermon each week with a message speaking about God and being meaningful to all who have ears. Yet this very trepidation was what got me started on my journey. I can't remember exactly what I have heard, but the time of study for each minute of a sermon equates out to about 1-2 hours. So an 11 minute sermon would equate to about 11-22 hours of thought, research, prayer, and writing each week. I will admit that sometimes it doesn't always come easy, other times the words are there, and far more often lately for me, the Holy Spirit has been whispering in my ear to guide me along the path.

This is just the case for my sermon entitled "Be Bold in your Faith" delivered on June 27, 2021. As I went to bed the week before, I had the Gospel Lesson swirling in my head, the lesson about the woman with hemorrhages and the temple leader's dying daughter. I couldn't get the lessons out of my head and wound up turning on the computer at about 1am and began writing. I felt such joy in my heart even when Sue, walking from the bathroom, said what are you doing at this hour? I replied nonchalantly that I was writing my sermon and she said ok and went back to bed. I continued on, eventually going back to bed filled with hope for the message I would share with you. But as the Holy Spirit goes, I was not done and on my way to the church a familiar tune came on the radio. I was blown away because it so beautifully captured the words and sense of the scripture, not to mention what Jesus had done for each of the women in our Gospel Lesson. The tune was Lay Your Hands on Me by Bon Jovi. I was so filled with joy and hope that I came in to ensure there were no questionable lyrics, as I grew up in the 80's full well knowing there could be an issue. To my delight, as I studied the lyrics and listened repeatedly to the music, I found none and knew that the Holy Spirit was pushing me to share what I had experienced.

I consulted with a few people and they agreed this would be a great message to share, so I went to work finding a version that could be viewed on our screen with the words prominently displayed. I spent an hour in the sanctuary listening to the tune over and over, going so far as to open windows and doors because the Good News should be shared with all who have ears. If only you could have seen the smile on my face as I played the music at different levels. I was in the company of the Holy Spirit and I was at peace. That is the mystery of God and the Holy Spirit at work within us and we are called to share these moments with those around us. I realize that some of you might have not enjoyed the rock and roll tenor of the song, but I am certain that hearing the sermon, seeing the words, and putting it together with the music of Lay Your Hands on Me might give you a new appreciation for the mysterious ways God acts in our lives.

I continue to welcome the Holy Spirit into my heart and will follow where it leads. I ask that you be open to experiencing new ways to embrace the Holy Spirit and how the Holy Spirit speaks to each of us. I am excited to be one of God's children called to be amongst you on our journey. Please do not hesitate to talk to me personally about any topic as I would appreciate the honest conversation.

May Jesus come to you in your need and lay his hands on you!
