

When I first arrived at St. Paul's there was excitement in the air because you had just agreed to a partnership with Frederick East Classical and subsequently the church and its grounds were alive with the vitality of youth. We are still hoping that our endeavor together will provide the fruit of new members in our church, yet the last year and a half of pandemic have put a severe damper on that quest. Still in all, we have members who have children, grandchildren, nieces and nephews who would benefit from joining us in our Christian Education Program. Belinda has worked tirelessly to provide a faith-based platform for our children, whether it be through her weekly garden bible study, garden tales, or even an on-line version of vacation bible school. Starting out with Tori Valcarcel, Belinda, and myself, with Russ Mildenstein now rounding out the Gathered at the Table Series we have gone through our Lutheran Foundations to explore the Lord's Prayer, the Creeds, Holy Communion, and now working our way through the Social Statements of the ELCA.

This is just the tip of the iceberg for us as we have great plans for our upcoming Sunday School year for kids and adults as well. While we are still working out the format for adult Sunday School, we have several thoughts and options planned. However, in order for us to have a successful children's education year we need a few things on a consistent basis. First and foremost, we need your kids and knowing who will be in attendance will be a great help for structuring the educational program.

Belinda is planning on using the one room schoolhouse format, of which you can touch base with her for further details. Second, we need volunteers to teach, mentor, and be with our children as we continue their faith formation. We cannot do it alone and would appreciate all the assistance we can get. The more folks we have to help, the less the burden will be on you to participate with our youth and make it more enjoyable for all involved.

Currently, we are planning on having Christian Education the 2-4 th Sundays of the month with the 1 st Sunday being reserved for fellowship, gathering, and reconnecting with those we may have lost touch with. It is our intent that the 1 st Sunday will be similar to the Summer Chat format with various entities sponsoring light refreshments and hearty conversation. Worship and Arts intends to sponsor our first chat on October 3, 2021, in honor of the Blessing of our new organ.

We have a lot to be thankful for at St. Paul's and even more to be hopeful for in our future together. Engaging together in the service of Christ, we will realize the rewards of our efforts and see the Glory of God in our midst. Would you be willing to host a book study, bible study, or other effort in your home? There is more to being a congregation than just being in the

church building. I ask you to search your hearts, feel the Holy Spirit at work within you, and find a way to engage in the life of our church. Should you not know how or what to become involved in, I am glad to walk with you through that period of discernment.

Council Corner

It was a scant 27 years ago when some crazy kids decided to put on a fundraiser featuring authentic German food. Over the years it has grown into an event people come from far and wide to attend. This will be our 26th annual German dinner having missed last year due to uncertainty with the covid-19 virus. Our committee decided early on to make sure we wouldn't miss this year by doing it a bit different. The Dinner will be a pre-pay only and drive-thru pick up event.

Some things have evolved within the framework of the dinner over the years, but the constant is the food. We still use Regina Bakers recipes to prepare the meal and the wurst are authentically made by Binkerts in Baltimore. We've gone from round tables to long rectangles to seat the increased attendance. A craft and bake table were added. We have a live band playing festive music. The beauty of which is they play for their supper (performing for free). The people working the dinner have changed as well. Due to an aging congregation, we have reached out to other groups to help fill some gaps and build a wider community involvement. The young Marines, Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops as well as Frederick East Classical have donated their time with us. I frequently hear people are amazed that our congregation could pull off a dinner for 500-800 people based on our size. It's a credit to the members who donate time and resources every year. Regina told me this has been the case from the beginning. The other partner in this operation is The Walkersville Fire Company. They allow us to use the fire hall for the dinner and we support them by working at the Carnival. This benefits both of us greatly.

The first German Dinner in 1994 served between 300-400 people. The records we've kept show in 1997 we made \$2,755. Our profit in 2019 was \$7,404. We started tracking attendance in 2006 and sold 502 dinners that year. Our most recent dinner in 2019 had a count of 590. Our peak was in 2010 when the Frederick News Post wrote an article on the event, (we sold out in an hour and a half) serving 755 patrons in that short period of time. I'm sure a few of us still wake up in a cold sweat from that one.

As we move closer to the fall it's time to dust off the dirndls and lederhosen and prepare to feed our community as we do each year. I look forward to seeing our veteran and new volunteers pull off yet another wonderful event. Never forget September is for sausage and fellowship!

Kick-off a new year of learning and growing in Christ on September 19th at 10:45am. If the weather cooperates, we will be celebrating the beginning of the fall season outside on the Fulton Avenue lawn, otherwise we will be in the Social Hall.

Faith Formation classes will return to in person participation for all ages. Sessions will be an hour long from 10:45am until 11:45am every Sunday through May except the 1st Sunday of the month. Youth Mental Health First Aid Course—NEW DATE!

St. Paul's is hosting a course, on October 9 th from 9am until 3pm, to help you identify and respond to youth and young adults coping with a mental health situation. One in five teens and young adults lives with a mental health condition, how can you help? This course will equip you to assess for risk of suicide or harm, listen nonjudgmentally, give and information, reassurance encourage professional help and to encourage self-help and other support strategies. This training is so important! Registration is open until September 11th and is required for participation.
