



Comments from the Cloud of Witnesses

Jesus rebukes Martha, and we need to rediscover the revolutionary potential of the concept of ministry suggested in this gospel reading. Service is not a code word for a new power trip, nor a sanctimonious way of justifying the servitude of the enslaved. It is a revolution that overthrows all these models of relationship. It means the self-emptying of alienated male power, even alienated divine power. It is God who begins the kenosis, or emptying, of power projected on the throne of heaven. It is God who becomes a servant, pulling out the foundations of all other kings and lords to use the divine as the model of hierarchy. Only by becoming one with the liberation of all the poor and oppressed do all of us, female and male, black and white, poor and rich, discover our own wholeness, in ourselves and with each other. —Rosemary Radford Ruether



Refugee Resettlement Project message from Pastor Dave SImpson:

We have had commitments for everything we need for a while, the Commitment Form has been signed, and I had a follow-up meeting with LSSNCA. And I'm relatively well (just some residual fatigue).

THE NEXT STEP is Volunteer Training - for EVERYONE who will have any contact with the family in person, by phone, email, etc.

If you are just going to help "behind the scenes" you don't need to attend the training. But we need to get everyone trained that we can.

Here are two possible dates/times:

Tuesday, July 26, at 6:00 pm Wednesday, July 27 at 6:00 pm

The training will be on Zoom.

Please let me know which you can attend (or if you can attend both). I'll get with LSSNCA to confirm the one with the most respondents.

If it turns out you CAN"T make it - they do offer make-up trainings.

The additional requirement is that everyone who will have contact with the family have a background check. Background checks for other organizations DO NOT count. There is a \$30 fee for the check paid by the volunteer. (If that's a problem, let me know and we'll cover it out of the funds that have been donated for this project). 
