Quilt Blessing


On Sunday, July 3, we will bless 37 quilts. Since last summer, Quilt Ministry has made 103 twin-size quilts, most with children's motifs, for charity. So far, we have placed 25: 15 at Faith House, a local shelter for mothers and children, and 10 at a church in Baltimore for a new ministry. That leaves 78 "homeless" quilts! Now we are taking a break from sewing while we search for homes for these remaining quilts. During this hiatus, we will continue to accept donations of cash and fabric and, as always, appreciate your generous support as we feed the bodies, minds and spirits of those in need with this important Ministry of love.
