## **Pastor's Peace**

"Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you." **Luke 6:38** 

As I sit here with my last full day on the lake in the Adirondacks, I am mesmerized by the beauty of the gifts we have been given by our Creator. The crystal clear lake, fresh crisp air, and majesty of the mountains are what always draw me back to my favorite sanctuary of peace and rest. This is the place I come to recharge my batteries and find respite from the hustle and bustle of everyday life. As we enter the Fall season we often take these places or whatever place brings you joy for granted, even if it is our own back yard. Places like this rely on our generosity and stewardship to maintain and perpetuate the continued legacy in our communities. As I tool up the lake or am hiking any of the trails, I often find trash, pick it up, and carry it out so that others can revel in the beauty our God has created.

Generosity doesn't end with us just stewarding our neighborhoods for the sake of our planet, yet that is a very important facet of what it means to follow the tasks God has given us in maintaining and being a part of all he has provided for us in our journey on earth. Generosity includes sharing your time, talents, and treasures with our church so that we can further a life of Christ through our fellowship together. Many of our members share their gifts with the church and our community by volunteering time and other resources to further St. Paul's social outreach in our community through events at Victoria Park, worship at Autumn Lake, volunteering in the Thrift Shop, and providing meals at the Frederick Soup Kitchen just to name a few. These events take resources and financial support which we have been able to accomplish through the gifts of our members, budgeted funds, Thrivent Choice Dollars, and other avenues of revenue. Additionally, Congregational Life utilizes some of its funds monthly to support Glade Valley Services and a designated local charity doing work in our community.

I believe a lot of us get overwhelmed when we are consistently asked to support a variety of things over the life of our time together. We have a large number of members who have not made a contribution nor have they joined us in worship in over a year. If only this group of people would contribute \$20 per month/ family for the year, our financial picture would be in a more sustainable position allowing us to undertake some projects such as repair of the stained glass windows. I understand that many of us have had financial hardship over the last two and a half years, yet there is always some way we can seek ways to be generous with all we have to offer. Over the last two years we have not entertained a Generosity campaign because of the considerations we have given to each other's struggles. We have heard about individual generosity journeys people have taken, as well as why St. Paul's is important to them in their lives in hopes this would touch our hearts and kindle the fire of generosity within each of us. I believe that Sue and I do our parts in sharing our financial gifts with St. Paul's, are among the top three givers in this community, and yet there is probably more we can do which will be part of our annual discernment process.

Where is it that you will discern to be able to be more generous with our church community? Will you step up to take on the role of council person, volunteer for Trunk or Treat, become a new member, donate to Harvest Home Sunday, volunteer at the thrift shop or soup kitchen, or find a way to increase your giving so that we can continue our growth and support of our community? "11 You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God. 12 This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of the Lord's people but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God." 2 Corinthians 9:11-12
