Amazing Grace Holy Week

Easter Sunday: Mary Magdalene

Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord." John 20:18

- 1 Jesus Christ is ris'n today, Alleluia! our triumphant holy day, Alleluia! who did once upon the cross, Alleluia! suffer to redeem our loss. Alleluia!
- 2 Hymns of praise then let us sing, Alleluia! unto Christ, our heav'nly king, Alleluia! who endured the cross and grave, Alleluia! sinners to redeem and save. Alleluia!
- 3 But the pains which he endured, Alleluia! our salvation have procured; Alleluia! now above the sky he's king, Alleluia! where the angels ever sing. Alleluia!
- 4 Sing we to our God above, Alleluia! praise eternal as his love; Alleluia! praise him, all you heav'nly host, Alleluia! Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. Alleluia!

Call to Worship

- P: In the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- P: Christ is risen!
- C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!
- P: The Lord is my strength and my song; he has become my salvation.
- C: Glad songs of salvation are in the tents of the righteous:
- P: "The right hand of the Lord does valiantly,
- C: The right hand of the Lord exalts, the right hand of the Lord does valiantly!"
- P: I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord.
- C: The Lord has disciplined me severely, but he has not given me over to death.
- P: Open to me the gates of righteousness, that I may enter through them and give thanks to the Lord.
- C: This is the gate of the Lord; the righteous shall enter through it.
- P: I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation.
- C: The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone.
- P: This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes.
- C: This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it.
- P: Christ is risen!
- C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Confession and Forgiveness

- P: The Lord Jesus, who earlier had healed Mary Magdalene, sent her on that first Easter morning to be one of the first witnesses to his resurrection. Let us confess our sins to God and ask his forgiveness, praying that he would send us out as witnesses to his resurrection.
- C: Almighty God, we have sinned against you in our thoughts, words and actions. Instead of living in the power of our Savior's resurrection, we follow our own selfish and sinful desires. We turn from your holy Word and listen instead to temptations of world around us. We often live to please ourselves instead of serving others in Jesus' name. Have mercy on us and forgive our sins.
- P: As the Lord showed grace to Mary Magdalene, healing her and sending her as a witness, he shows grace to us. Jesus our Savior suffered and died for our sins and rose to life on the first Easter morning. I announce to you that your sins are forgiven in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- C: I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord ... This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it!
- P: Christ is risen!
- C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

Prayer of the Day

P: Almighty God, you sent your Son to be our Savior, to suffer and die for us. On the third day after his death, Jesus was raised to life, never to die again and victorious over sin, death and the devil. As Jesus healed Mary Magdalene, casting out the demons that possessed her, we have been healed by his wounds, our sins forgiven. As Mary Magdalene and the other women at the empty tomb went out to share the joyful news of Jesus' resurrection, we, too, have good news to share. Lead us to be faithful, eager witnesses for our risen and reigning Lord Jesus, sharing the Gospel with others so that they, too, will come to know and worship him as Lord. Hear our prayer and accept our Easter praise in Jesus' name. Amen.

C: Amen.

Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

P: Crucified and risen Lord, you sent the women from the empty tomb to tell your disciples the joyful news of your resurrection. Give us the courage to be faithful witnesses to you, our living Lord and King so that, in the power of the Spirit, we can bring hope to a world lost in darkness of sin. Help us to bring to others the light of Easter morning, the light of forgiveness and life for all who believe. Gracious Lord,

C: Have mercy on us and hear our prayer.

P: Crucified and risen Lord, we give you thanks and praise for your amazing grace. In grace, you called sinners, named and unnamed in Scripture, to serve in your kingdom: David, Isaiah, the blind man, the woman at the well, Paul, Peter, John, the repentant thief and Mary Magdalene. In grace, you have forgiven our sins and called us, as you called these other saints, to serve in your kingdom. Gracious Lord,

C: Have mercy on us and hear our prayer.

P: Amen.

*THE GREAT THANKSGIVING (ELW, p.152)

- P: The Lord be with you.
- C: And also with you.

P: It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks and praise to you, almighty and merciful God, for the glorious resurrection of our Savior Jesus Christ, the true Paschal Lamb who gave himself to take away our sin, who in dying has destroyed death, and in rising has brought us to eternal life. And so with Mary Magdalene and Peter and all the witness of the resurrection, with earth and sea and all their creatures, and with angels and archangels, cherubim and seraphim, we praise your name and join in their unending hymn:

Do this in remembrance of me. Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. 
