# Pastor's Peace

On April 25, 2023, the Covenant between Bethel and St. Paul's was presented to the St. Paul's review Council for and comment. After some discussion, those in attendance unanimously approved the Covenant to be referred to the Congregation for its review and hopeful approval. The folks who were not in attendance at the Council meeting also approved the Covenant for referral to the Congregation. The Synod office has also approved the Covenant between the churches and it can now be brought before each congregation for a vote. As we have done for our Annual Congregational Meeting, we will sponsor a "town hall" meeting before the Special Congregational meeting so as to answer any questions posed and aid members in understanding the process and how we move forward. There will be a couple of other items on the agenda for

Special Congregational the Meeting, one of which is to explore the possibility of Sue and I moving into the Parsonage once Belinda and her family have moved on. We will be seeking your approval for this to occur sometime in the fall. This move will allow me to be more accessible to this church community and to Bethel as well. Should you have questions about this potential move, please do not hesitate to see me for my thoughts. At this time, we Town Hall anticipate the Meeting being scheduled for June 4, 2023, immediately following worship with the Special Congregational Meeting being scheduled for June 18, 2023, immediately following worship.

There will not be much change in the way we do business at St. Paul's once we ratify the Covenant and move forward down that path. However, this partnership will necessitate a change in worship time for both congregations so as to allow me time to meet with members of St. Paul's following worship, to participate in Ministry Sunday, and time to travel to Bethel to prepare for worship there.

The change in time is not that radical as we will suggest worship at St. Paul's be moved to 9am and worship at Bethel will be moved to 11:15am. Additionally, it has been proposed that on days in which I have vacation. worship will alternate between St. Paul's and Bethel to accommodate the shortage of supply pastors. Please do not hesitate to speak with me or any of your council members with questions you might have leading up to these minor changes. This is an exciting time for each congregation as we grow together to serve as Christ in our community.

I am thankful for Lauren McCloskey and her willingness to step into the role of shepherding our vacation bible school this summer. Please seek out Lauren if you can assist in any way. As of this writing, VBS is scheduled for June 26-29, 2023, and further details will be provided.

# **Quilt Ministry**

What is Quilt Ministry?—Quilt Ministry is an offshoot of Congregational Life Ministry, dedicated to making quilts for those in need. We make lap quilts, twin size adult quilts and—our specialty—twin size children's quilts for distribution to local charities and individuals. Last year, over 100 lap quilts and nearly 90 twin ones were sent into the community in Christ's name to warm bodies and spirits. Earlier this year, 2 dozen quilts were donated to Children of Incarcerated Parents.

Quilt Blessing Update—During the Service on Sunday, April 23, 50 twin size quilts were Blessed. Six of these, women's quilts, answered a request from Faith House, a Frederick facility for women with children. Twenty children's quilts went to Heartly House, a domestic abuse shelter. In June, a total of 30 quilts for children and teens will go to Sleep in Heavenly Peace (a.k.a. "No kid sleeps on the floor"), a volunteer organization that builds beds for needy children. A representative will visit us for a Sunday Service and give a presentation about their mission.

Would you like to help?—In addition to your prayers, there are four ways to assist Quilt Ministry:

- Sew quilts at home. No cutting or designing involved. See Kate Stottlemyer for details.
- Knot quilts. Meet Kate in the Parish Hall on random Saturdays (TBA) from 9-3. Drop by any time, for any length of time. No experience required.
- Donate fabric, especially colors and prints that would appeal to children. (Woven lightweight cotton/cotton blends work well.)
- Donate cash toward the purchase of fabric, thread and batting. (Batting is the stuffing, the middle of the quilt "sandwich", and the most pricey part.) Clearly label your donation. At this time, we especially need cash donations.
