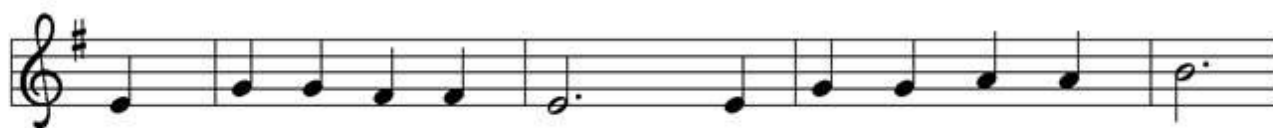

Comments from the Cloud of Witnesses

The vineyard should not be too hastily or too completely identified with the church. Matthew identifies it with the Kingdom of God. It would well be viewed as the world, or at least as God's method of dealing with everyone. Moreover, it is the tenants, not the vineyard, who stand at the center of the parable. If these tenants represented the faithless leaders of Israel, then the new tenants represent the leaders of the church. The threat under which the former renters stood remains doubly valid for the new renters. In other words, the allegory becomes a two-edged sword, with a message for every generation of tenants.

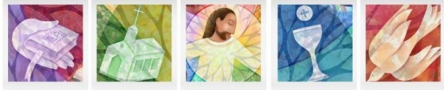

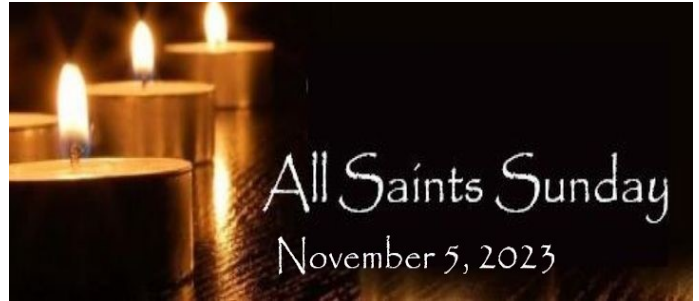
