Comments from the Cloud of Witnesses

Sometimes it seemed to Marie d'Oignies that for three or more days she held Christ close to her so that he nestled between her breasts like a baby. St. Jerome testified that when St. Paula came to Bethlehem, she saw him as a baby lying in a crib, and he manifested himself also to Marie in a form that was in keeping with the feast. Thus he showed himself at the Nativity as though he were a baby sucking at the breasts of the Virgin Mary or crying in his cradle. At the Feast of the Purification she saw the blessed virgin offering her son in the temple and Simeon receiving him in his arms. In this vision she exulted no less from joy than if she had been present herself when this happened in the temple. Thus she was transformed throughout the course of a whole year in different ways and was wondrously filled with love.
