Pastor's Peace



During this past year we experienced many things, joy, sadness, excitement, trepidation, and most of all we experienced a new beginning with Bethel Lutheran Church. Our partnership together has benefited each congregation in the realization of financial stability, joint worship, ecumenical partnerships, and other dreams we have for the future. As part of our agreement together there will be times when I take some time off and the two congregations will share worship in each other's sanctuaries. Thus far, Bethel has worshipped at St. Paul's on a few occasions and will continue to do so. Yet in the spirit of our agreement, St. Paul's will also worship at Bethel for various times and events throughout the church year. The opportunities to worship in each other's sanctuaries provides members from both churches the ability to worship at different times on a particular Sunday and other moments where you would find it more convenient.

During the Season of Lent, Bethel will share a meal and worship with us on our Journey to the Cross each Wednesday night. As usual the soup and sandwich meal will begin at 6pm with worship beginning at 7pm. The First Sunday of Lent (February 18, 2024) will see me taking a few days off for some R& R with high school friends. The Sunday worship for this day will be at Bethel at 11:15am with a supply pastor and much as we have embraced the members of Bethel in joining us at St. Paul's, it would be tremendous to share the same cordiality with them in their worship space. Other than February 18, 2024, this will be the only Sunday during Lent that we share a worship service. However, we will have some time to share each other's company during Holy Week with a Service of Healing on Wednesday, March 27, 2024, at St. Paul's. We will also strip the altar at St. Paul's at the conclusion of the service. On Maundy Thursday, March 28, 2024, we will worship together at Bethel at 7pm. Bethel is also contemplating a simple meal before worship of which plans are still being made.

Good Friday will offer opportunities to worship in both spaces with a service at Noon at Bethel and a service at 7pm at St. Paul's. Similarly, Easter Worship will be in both places at our normal times. I am considering a Sunrise Service on the lawn, and I am told we may have a return to our Easter Breakfast.

While we have been active in a variety of ministries in which we have shared meals with members of our community, Roxanne Smith is trying to live out our Mission Statement of "Through Christ we joyfully feed the body, mind and spirit of all" by partnering with Woodsboro Lutheran Church in supplementing their

monthly community meal with a meal that we at St. Paul's and Bethel can come together and sponsor. Roxanne will be a trial run for this on January 20, 2024, at Woodsboro Lutheran and she is seeking volunteers to assist in this endeavor. This is a way for us to give back to our community and to seek out those on the margins who are struggling to make ends meet. Please search your heart for ways in which you can be involved. If we have enough volunteers, it would not be a monthly commitment, but would be more spaced out and less time consuming.

As always we will be gearing up for our Annual Strawberry Festival which will be upon us before we know it. One of the items of feedback we received last year was that people missed the yard sale. We are thankful for all the work Belinda put into this endeavor and I'm sure if we had someone interested in restarting this portion of our day, we would certainly benefit. Please see if there is a way you could be involved and if you aren't sure about what you can do, ask a member of any of our ministry groups and they will be happy to point you in the right direction. Be a part of our new beginnings and let your heart be filled with the Holy Spirit where we all benefit from the HOPE, PEACE, JOY, and LOVE of Christ in our lives.
