



C: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.




*THE LORD'S PRAYER:



Comments from the Cloud of Witnesses

All that matters is the cross and dying on that cross: there is no other way to life and real inward peace except the way of the holy cross, and of daily dying to self. 


There will be no altar flowers during Lent, but please feel free to sign up for Easter and after!


