He is Risen! He is Risen indeed! What a glorious way to end our Lenten Journey to the Cross as we come together and celebrate one of the greatest mysteries of our faith. We are gladdened by the fact we have been given the gift of Christ in our lives and all is well with our souls. As I write this, we are entering Holy Week and have just experienced a great procession of our youth and our choir into the church waving their palms, singing Hosanna and sporting glad faces as they ushered us in to the week where we experience a variety of emotions. It was truly a heart inspiring moment with a worship space filled with over 80 faithful in person and almost 30 joining us online to continue our walk to the cross, the place we find Jesus. Each year our Council and other leaders from our congregation come together for a leadership retreat shortly after our new Council is seated. This year we also included the leadership from Bethel Lutheran Church to join us and learn to grow and love as Christ has taught. This year we were blessed to have Pastor Carla Christopher, assistant to the Bishop for Justice Ministries, lead our discussion and learning. This was an effort to follow up on our Gathered at the Table Series in which we explored the ELCA Social statements. Specifically, Pastor Carla spoke to us about the LGBTQ+ community and how Jesus calls us to love one another even if we don't understand or agree. As in the ELCA Social Statements, we are not necessarily called to agree with one another but we are called to treat each other with love, respect, and caring. The session with Pastor Carla certainly clarified many things for me, and I dare say our leaders who were in attendance. There are still questions to explore and much wisdom to be gathered as we journey to the Cross and journey together in life. Pastor Carla will join us July 14, 2024, to share God's message of love and to have fellowship with us. This is an opportunity for us to explore something different and find ways to embrace all of God's children. We are a community of love and it is the Love of Christ we are called to share.



Quilt Ministry

What is Quilt Ministry?—Quilt Ministry is an offshoot of Congregational Life Ministry, dedicated to making quilts for those in need. We make lap quilts, twin size adult quilts and—our specialty twin size children's quilts for distribution to local charities and individuals. Last year, 205 twin quilts were sent into the community in Christ's name to warm bodies and spirits.

Quilt Blessing—During the Service later this Spring there will be a blessing of at least 40 twin size quilts.

Would you like to help?-

In addition to your prayers, there are four ways to assist Quilt Ministry:

- Sew quilts at home. No cutting or designing involved. See Kate Stottlemyer for details.
- Knot quilts. Meet Kate in the Parish Hall on random Saturdays (TBA) from 9-3. Drop by any time, for any length of time. No experience required.
- Donate fabric, especially colors and prints that would appeal to children. (Woven lightweight cotton/cotton blends work well.)
- Donate cash toward the purchase of fabric, thread and batting. (Batting is the stuffing, the middle of the quilt "sandwich", and the most pricey part.) Clearly label your donation.
