<sup>"12</sup> For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. <sup>13</sup> For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink into one Spirit. <sup>14</sup> For in fact the body is not one member but many." — 1 Corinthians 12:12-14.

In the near future we will be sending out a letter to members who have not been active participants in the life of the congregation. The first thing this letter mentions is that we have missed them and wish them good health.

The letter in essence is one that welcomes these members back into active participation in our congregation. When we went through the process of updating our Constitution, we updated the descriptors of what it meant to be a member of St. Paul's. Our Constitution defines an active member as one who will have voting privileges when we come together to do the business of the church and is identified as one who has communed and made a financial contribution in the past year. When we updated our software for financial and membership applications, a part of the consideration for the cost of this software is the number of active members we have in our congregation. So in faithful stewardship of the funds you share with your church, we are in the process of updating our records, and more importantly, want to

Third, if you have become a member of another congregation, please let me or the church office know so that we can make this update to our records.

Finally, if you are indeed inactive here and are not involved in another congregation, I would like to encourage you to find a church home, even if it is somewhere other than St. Paul's Lutheran in Walkersville. It is vitally important to have the support of a church family, especially in this day and time when it is more and more difficult to live out our faith in a world that is more and more secular.

If you have moved away from the area and need to know what congregations are nearby, I can certainly help you find another Lutheran congregation."

The letter has been approved by the Generosity Committee who presented it to St. Paul's Council for approval and action which they did. Again, this letter is meant to be an invitation back into the life of St. Paul's and to be in community with those who miss your presence.
