HOLY, HOLY, HOLY (ELW Pg. 207)




*THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE:



Comments for the Cloud of Witnesses

Faith is looking at a valley of dry bones and hearing the wind of the Spirit calling them to live. It is looking at our death-bound world and hearing God tell us to prophesy to a despairing land. 
