***THE NICENE CREED**

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son,* who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. 





For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.


*THE LORD'S PRAYER:

Comments from the Cloud of Witnesses

The mustard seed is indeed very plain, and of little value: but if bruised or crushed, it shows forth its power. So faith first seems a simple thing; but if it is bruised by its enemies, it gives forth proof of its power, so as to fill others who hear or read of it with the odor of its sweetness. The Lord himself is the grain of mustard seed. He chose to be bruised, he chose to be crushed; he chose to be planted in the earth as a seed. For it was in a garden that Christ was taken prisoner, and likewise buried: he spring up in a garden, where he also rose from the dead, and became a tree. You also then are to sow Christ in your garden. Plant the Lord Jesus. He is a seed when we take hold of him: he is a tree that gives shade to the word; he is a seed when he is buried in the earth; he is a tree when raised to heaven. —Ambrose


