



Council Minutes June 18, 2024

Attendees: Pastor Phil Beck, Ellen Bucheimer, Barb and Bill Cartwright, Sheila Kahler, Lauren McCloskey, Patty Rimel, Roxanne Smith, Kate Stottlemyer, Jackie Waas.

Call to Order: 7 pm. **Devotion:** Kate.

May Minutes: Sheila moved to approve, Jackie seconded, carried.

June Benevolence: Congregational Life Ministry moved to approve \$100 to the Frederick Rescue Mission, Jackie seconded, carried. Pastor recommended Christ Church to Congregational Life for consideration for July Benevolence.

Reports:

• Treasurer: Bill reported a \$2,851 deficit year-to-date.

- Christian Education: Faith Formation starts September 15, with Rally Day on August 25.
- Worship & Arts: We will use 3 settings per year.
- Media & Tech: Mount St. Mary's and Hood have agreed to offer Internships for us, available in September.
- Generosity: Will broadcast series "What it Means to be Lutheran in a Crucial Election Year" at church beginning with the June 25 session; Pastor will check time zone; Pastor wrote up advertisement for St. Paul's and other churches.
- Property: Tom is trying to get the hole in the bricks fixed.
- Congregational Life: Will be hosting a Chat on July 14 for Pastor Carla; Pastor mentioned that she will be preaching at Bethel also; Lauren volunteered to "call" for future Bingo Nights.

New Business:

- Synod Assembly: Resolution on World Hunger, Patty arranged for someone to come do a Temple
 Talk in October; Resolution to reduce greenhouse emissions; Memorial on Bishop oversight;
 taking an offering for rebuilding at Christ Church, Inner Harbor due to fire.
- Facility Use: HOA missed facility use on June 17 due to email problem (they didn't know how to get into the building); Jackie suggested making sure instructions on how to get in were given with approval notice.
- LGBTQ Epistle Article: Discussion included intention to educate, education vs. indoctrination, need to talk with congregation members about Pastor Carla's visit to get "temperature" on issue (facilitate conversation), possible small group discussions, use of pronouns, agree to disagree lovingly.
- Constitutional Amendment (regarding number on Council): 9-12 people, needed by the next meeting to go out by September/October.

Motion to adjourn: Kate moved, Sheila seconded. **The Lord's Prayer**


