## Hats & Mitten Tree


***Give the gift of warmth!!***

# Pastor's Peace


*“Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever!”*  
Psalm 107:1

We have just concluded our November month of generosity, and we are grateful for all of the gifts you have shared with this community. Your time, talents, and treasures are greatly appreciated and welcomed in order that we be the voice of God in our loves. As we enter the Christmas season, our thoughts naturally turn to celebration, gathering, and joy. But at the heart of it all is a posture that shapes the entire Christian life: thanksgiving.

Christmas gives us a unique kind of gratitude, thankfulness rooted not in what we have accomplished, but in what God has done for us. I often remind this fellowship of saints that all we have, and especially all we receive in Christ, is pure gift with Christmas being the clearest expression of that grace. When Mary sings her Magnificat, she bursts forth in thanksgiving: “My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior.” Her song is not one of pride or self-congratulation, rather, it is filled with gratitude for God’s mercy, God’s faithfulness, and God’s surprising action in her life. This song is something for us to take to heart as we prepare to remember the Birth of our Lord, it should continue to write our story in our life with Christ.

We give thanks because God comes to us, not waiting for us to climb up to Him, but entering our world in vulnerability and love. In the Christ Child we meet a God who chooses humility, who chooses us, and who brings hope into the darkest corners of our lives. We give thanks because in Jesus, God’s promises are made visible, hope is no longer abstract, it is real and definitive. Peace is no longer out of reach, salvation is no longer a distant dream, and the love of God envelops us each and every day.

We give thanks because the Christmas story extends into our daily lives. The God who was born in a manger is the same God who meets us in Word and Sacrament, who forgives us, restores us, and sends us out in love. Christmas gratitude is not confined to one day, it shapes how we live, serve, and trust in the One who has already given us everything we truly need.

As we move through this season, perhaps with full schedules, family traditions, or quiet moments at home, I invite you to pause in genuine thanksgiving. Not simply for the blessings of the season but for the Blessing who came down from heaven to dwell with us. With hearts centered on Christ, may our lives echo Mary’s song:

*“The Mighty One has done great things for us, holy is His name. “Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!”*  
Luke 2:14
