Pastor's Peace

“For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat.” Matthew 25:35

As the calendar turns and we begin a new year together, many voices around us encourage “new beginnings,” fresh starts, and resolutions for self-improvement. While these desires are understandable, the Church offers a deeper and steadier hope, one that does not depend on our resolve, but on God’s faithfulness. In Christ, every day already begins anew.

Martin Luther reminds us that the Christian life is one of daily repentance and daily renewal. Each morning, we return to the promises spoken over us in Holy Baptism: that we belong to Christ, that our sins are forgiven, and that we are raised to new life by grace alone. The new year does not erase our past nor guarantee ease ahead, but it does place us once again firmly in God’s hands.

As we move into this new year, rather than asking, “What will I accomplish this year?” perhaps we can ask, “Where is God calling me to love and serve?” There are many opportunities to serve our church and in doing so, serve our community. God’s love is made manifest in how we love our neighbor, how we serve using our hands to do God’s work, and how we share our gifts with each other. We have entered into so many places of outreach; St. Paul’s is certainly sharing God’s love in many ways. We continue to live out our Mission Statement of “through Christ, we joyfully feed the body, mind, and spirit of all” and have found new resources to sustain the many we have been called to serve.

There will be challenges ahead as this congregation continues to seek out new and innovative ways to be church in the community. I would encourage you to consistently share with others how God’s love has permeated your life, to gather around Word and Sacrament, to pray for one another, to bear one another’s burdens, and to proclaim the hope we have in Jesus Christ. 
Where did 2025 go and how can it be 2026 already?


