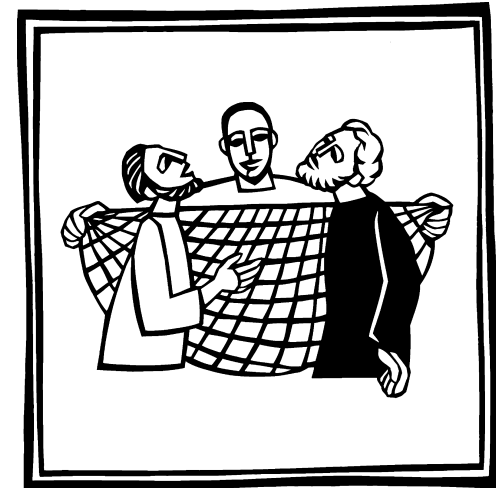

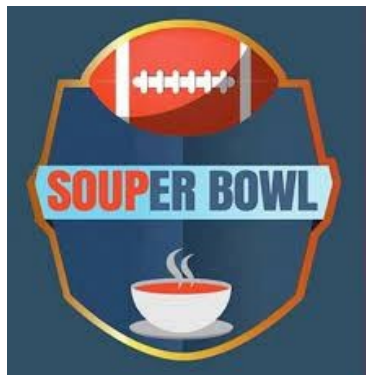
Donations for *Glade Valley Food Bank* are always accepted!
